Curriculum for Excellence links

It is intended that a visit to Montrose Air Station Heritage Centre will help work towards the following outcomes.

SOC 2-01a

I can use primary and secondary sources selectively to research events in the past.

SOC 2-02a

I can interpret historical evidence from a range of periods to help to build a picture of Scotland's heritage and my sense of chronology.

SOC 2-03a

I can investigate a Scottish historical theme to discover how past events or the actions of individuals or groups have shaped Scottish society.

SOC 2-04a

I can compare and contrast a society in the past with my own and contribute to a discussion of the similarities and differences.

SOC 2-06a

I can discuss why people and events from a particular time in the past were important, placing them within a historical sequence.

Activities available at the Museum include:

- a guided tour of the Heritage Centre from a volunteer at the Museum.
- finding out about the history of RAF Montrose and the people who served at the Air Station during both World Wars.
- a visit to a full scale Sea Vampire and Sopwith Camel.
- enjoying a visit to a 1940's room to experience life as it was during WW2.
- learning about how pilots were trained at Montrose and the tragedies that sometimes followed. Hear stories about the Air Station Ghost.
- experiencing a Links Trainer (available soon).
- trying out the Biplane to find out how an aeroplane functions.
- watching the History of Montrose Air Station Heritage Centre DVD.
- a visit to the classroom to receive a presentation about the Museum and to experience a range of activities, for example, Paper Helicopter Challenge. Uniforms are available for pupils to try on.
- a visit to the library (on request and more suitable for Secondary pupils)
